

Invest in Early Literacy



80% of physical brain development occurs in the first three years of life, as babies form over 1 million new neural connections per second.1



Later in life, at-risk children who do not receive high-quality early childhood experiences are 25% more likely to drop out of school, 40% more likely to become teen parents, and 60% less likely to attend college.2



Investment in high-quality early childhood programs for at-risk children from birth to age five delivers a 13% annual return on investment through improved education. health, social, and economic outcomes, increased productivity, and the reduced need for social spending.³
