- ENG 499 is not offered in summer.
- ENG 350 must be taken within the first 9 hours of coursework within the major.
- Professionalization Courses: Choose 2 from ENG 407, ENG 408 or ENG 431
- Specialist Courses: Choose 3 from ENG 204, ENG 263, ENG 354, ENG 467, ENG 476, or ENG 490.
- No more than six hours of ENG courses at the 200-level may count toward the BA degree in English. No credit hours in ENG with a grade lower than C may count toward the BA degree in ENG.

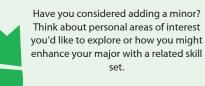
