West Virginia presents a diverse landscape with varying strengths and needs, sometimes within the same local education agency, community, and even the same school building.

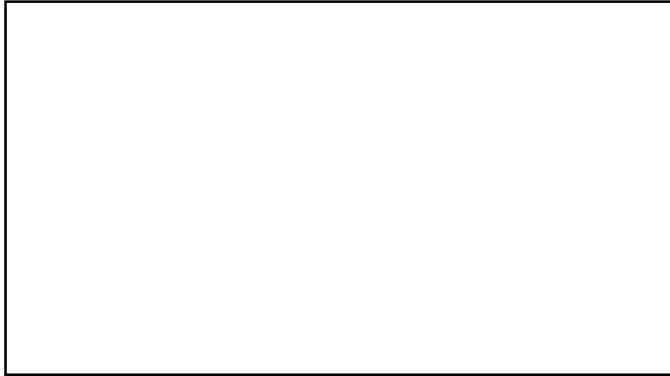

Courage to have honest conversations about the needs and lack of resources:

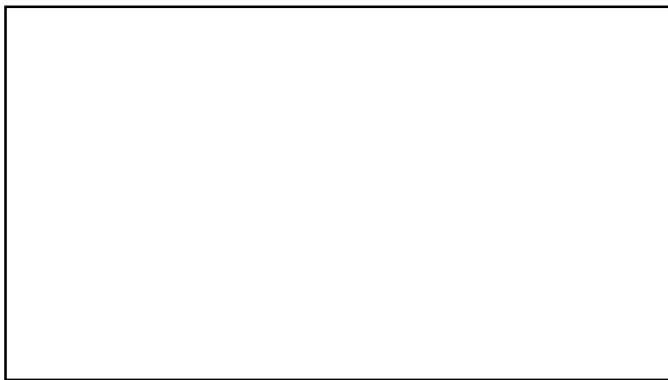
