Faculty receive the Dr. Robert P. Alexander Mentorship Award

The Dr. Robert P. Alexander Mentorship Award recognizes an outstanding individual who demonstrates exemplary mentorship to students at the Lewis College of Business. The award aims to celebrate those who inspire, guide, and foster student success, whether through academic advising, career development, or personal support.

Each year, the Executive Advisory Board selects one faculty member from the Lewis College of Business as the recipient. In addition, one non-faculty stakeholder—including staff, alumni, student peers, etc.—may also be recognized each year at the discretion of the Dean and Executive Advisory Board.

Dr. Marjorie McInerney was posthumously awarded for the 2024 nomination, with Dr. Subedi receiving the award in her stead.



Essentially, she told me "Mistakes will happen, but what makes a good student or good person, is learning from those mistakes, and being better because of them. That same semester, I made the Dean's list for the first time in a couple of years.
