READING TIPS

Be a role model- let your child see you readina!

Ask questions as you read

Make books easily accessible

Match words from books to objects in your environment

Act out parts of the story

READ ALOUD

Before Reading-Look at the front cover of the book and read the title. Ask your child to share what they know about the moon with you.

During Reading- Stop and point out both new and familiar objects to your child on each page and say their name. Ideas of objects to point out include a log, tree, mountain, etc.

After Reading-Take some time to go outside and observe the moon. Have your child make note of their observations by drawing a picture of what they see.

BOOK ACTIVITIES

- Moon Dough- Make a simple moon dough with your child by combining one cup
 of hair condition and two cups of corn starch.
- Moon Pups Movement- Revisit the different actions of the pups in the story. See how many of these actions that your child can imitate. For example, can they reach, tumble, howl, etc.?
